

What is the BFireSafe@School project about?

This is an ERASMUS+ funded project that has developed a new fire safety education programme for post primary schools in Europe



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Is this programme unique?

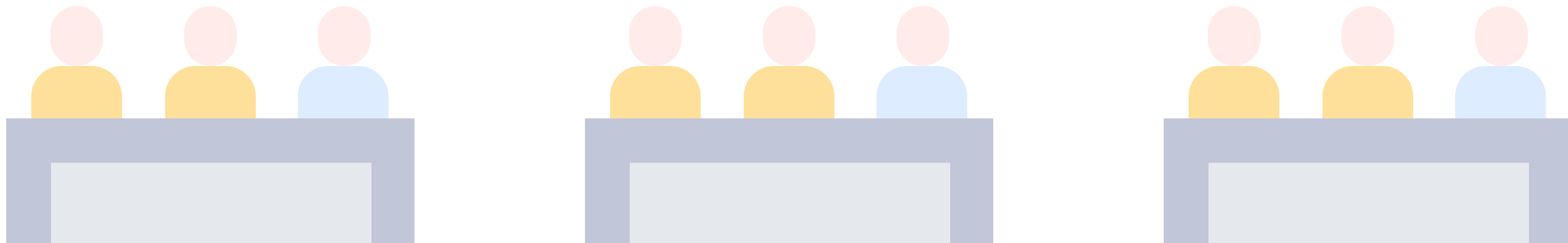
This programme is the first harmonised fire safety programme to be developed for schools across Europe



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What age group is it suitable for?

The content is suitable for pupils in post primary schools aged 12 - 18. Some modules are more suitable for 12-15 year olds, some for older students.

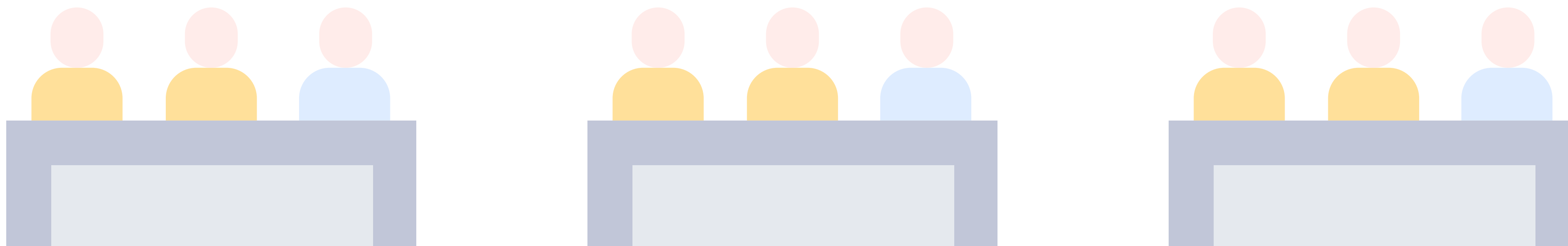


Who developed this new programme?

It was developed by a project consortium of 9 partners in 7 EU countries, the lead partner is Leitrim County Fire service. Project Coordinator is Finian Joyce Chief Fire Officer

How will the programme be delivered?

It is available in a variety of formats. It can be taught as a classroom lesson using powerpoints, video links, online training content and a Learning Management System.



What is included in the programme?

It is a short course that consists of 10 modules for various age groups suitable for Junior Cycle, Transition Year and Senior Cycle.. It can be integrated into existing subjects on the school curriculum, such as CSPE, Wellbeing, Science and Career guidance.

Unit 2 - Fire Science

Unit 3 - Fire Safety Indicators

Unit 4 - Case Studies

Unit 5 - Calling the emergency services

Unit 6 - Fire Safety in the Home

Unit 8 - Fire Safety in your Environment

Unit 9 - Emergency Action Plans

Unit 10 - Careers in Fire





What other innovations does the programme include?

The new programme contains an Augmented Reality app, science experiments, videos on evacuation, and information on careers in fire.

The programme will be taught by teachers in class and is available online also. Fire officers may assist the teachers in delivering some of the content in schools

This programme is supported by Fire and Rescue Services and post primary schools and teachers all over Europe



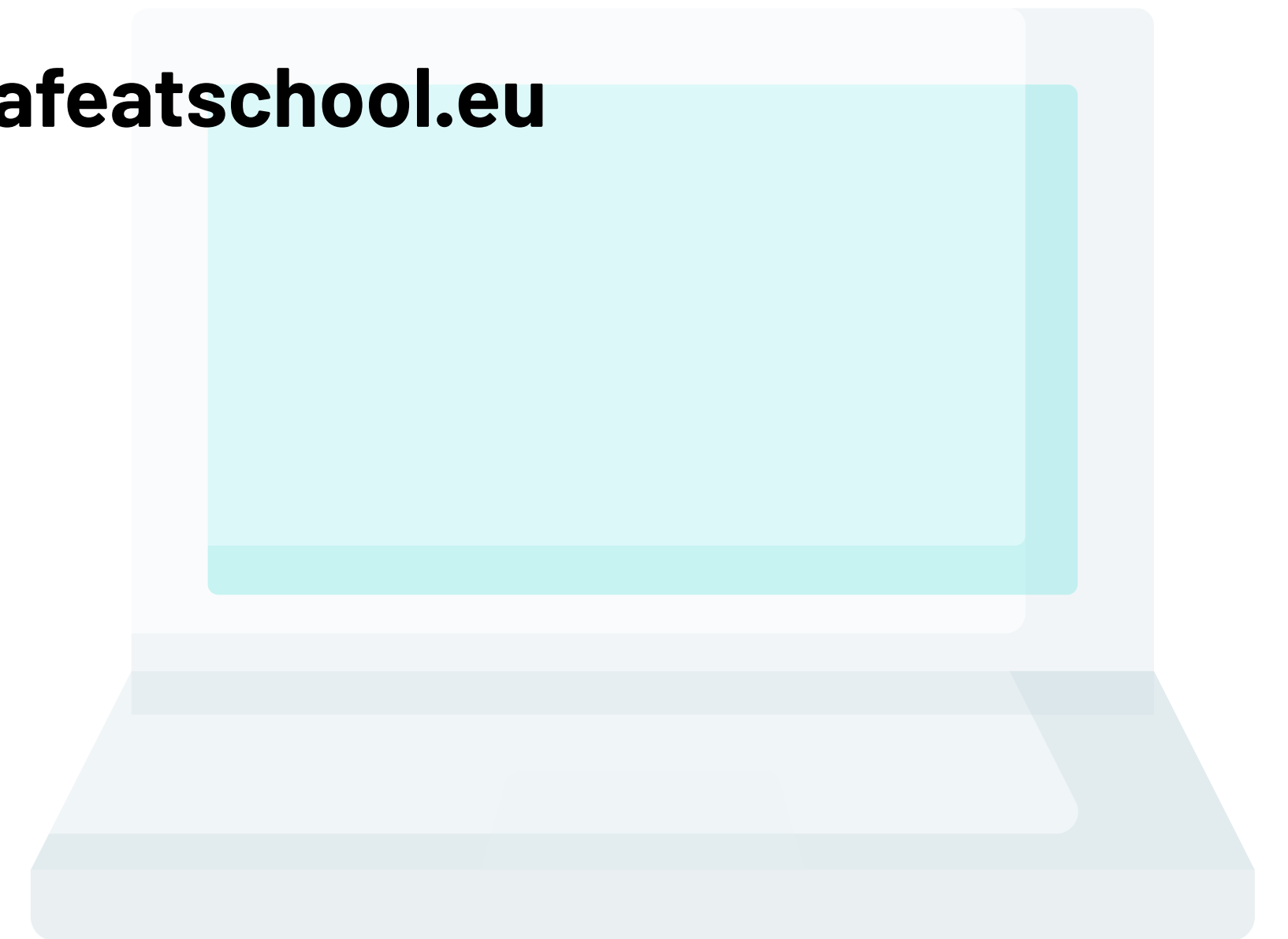
Was this programme pilot tested?
